

REVISED COPPER PENNY I & II COVID-19 INFORMATION (as of July 3rd, 2020)

- Each stable and individual attending should be diligent to make sure everyone coming is not ill and has no symptoms, brings and uses face coverings / masks and any personal protective equipment they feel necessary and practices proper social distancing and hand washing / sanitizing procedures to stay as safe as possible.
- Upon arrival, every person will be required to complete and sign a waiver, and will be given a wristband to wear. This wristband must be worn at all times while on the grounds and is used to enter the grounds each day. Anyone failing to produce a wristband upon request, sharing a wristband with others or failing to adhere to the process of using a wristband may be asked to leave the property or even disqualified from the show without refund.
- Every individual on the show grounds must insure that they are monitoring their temperature daily. Written records are no longer required as was in a previous plan. As per the CDC, people are considered to have a fever if their temperature is 100.4 degrees or higher. Any person that scans a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher must immediately leave the grounds, notify their trainer who must then immediately notify horse show management.
- Each stable is considered a family and will be provided stabling in blocks of stalls. This makes it critical that trainers submit or update a Block Stabling Request listing everyone in their barn to be stabled together.
- AS OF THIS DATE, ALL ENTRIES MUST BE DONE ONLINE - NO EXCEPTIONS ... you may not walk into the horse show office and bring a new entry or fill out an entry blank ... if you do, it will be refused!
- Each stable should designate a representative to handle all accounts with the show secretary and make every effort to only have this representative conducting business in the office. It is recommended that the trainer assume this role. If that person is not available to go to the office when needed, another individual may take their place, but the idea is to have as few different people as possible going into the office. No juniors or children are allowed in the office at any time.
- Management will limit the number of people in the horse show office to two people at a time. Those waiting outside must practice proper social distancing from others that may be waiting as well.
- Only essential people may accompany horses to the warm-up area and the back gate ... this could include the trainer, a groom and one family member if the rider is a junior. All others should go directly from the barn to the viewing area at the show ring to watch their family member or barn mate compete. Plan to bring your own chairs as the facility is currently not permitted to provide any public seating.
- Proper social distancing, both among people and horses, in the stabling areas, warm-up rings, back gates and viewing areas must be exercised at all times ... horse show staff have full authority to ask groups to disperse if necessary.
- All horse show staff and competitors must wear face coverings / masks at all times while on the grounds. Masks are optional while mounted and will not be penalized by judges if worn in the show ring. It is permissible for individuals to step away from others to temporarily remove their face covering / mask if necessary for any reason, but they should be replaced as soon as possible or before moving back towards others.
- Due to established schedules and the need for some individuals to know when they are showing, classes will not be held open for any exhibitors who are not ready to show or who have conflicts. Trainers and riders are responsible for working out any potential conflicts well in advance.
- All ribbons and prizes must be picked up from the awards room. No presentations will be held in any rings except for winners of a few of the special classes, if agreed upon by all parties.
- Due to current Covid-19 restrictions, hospitality will be greatly limited this year. Complimentary water bottles will be available at certain locations, but you should plan to bring your own as paper cups and water dispensers will not be available at the back gates. The food and beverage concession under the Grandstand will be open every day with a limited menu. A limited assortment of snacks in the Awards Room will also be available each day.
- If the show or classes are canceled for any reason, refunds will not be given for classes already held and for occupied stalls and RV spaces.

Updates, changes and additions to this list and further information will be published on the CEP website as it becomes available from the CDC, State and County health officials. Please check it often. Trainers must review the latest procedures and precautions related to this plan with their clients prior to arrival to the show, are responsible for their clients during the show and must understand that repeated issues may result in their clients being disqualified from the show with no refund and removed from the grounds if necessary.
