# SHOW RULES

1. All checks should be made payable to: GOLD CREST.

2. No refunds will be given unless accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate.

3. Stalls will be available for a fee of \$40.00 per night, or \$100 for the weekend. Four bags of shavings are required per stall. Call or text Jenny for stall and

bedding orders at 303.875.6184.

4. Returned or unpaid checks must be paid in cash or certified funds within 10 days. A \$50.00 NSF fee will be charged.

5. Non-showing horses must pay an office fee, EMT fee and a grounds fee.

# **REGULATIONS**

1. Back to back rounds allowed and encouraged.

2. No-judges will be allowed as long as time permits.

3. Hard hats and boots with a heel must be worn at all times by all riders while on show grounds.

4. Controlled schooling will be allowed from 6:30 - 7:50 am. Schooling times on any one horse may be limited if other horses are waiting.

5. The show management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any class[es] should it be in the best interest of the show.

6. Only one horse per entry form.

7. A one minute gate and/or a posted order of go may be imposed by management in order to maintain a reasonable pace for the show ring.

8. Each class will award a first place trophy and ribbons through sixth place.

9. Champion and Reserve will be offered for all divisions.

10. Pets must be on a leash at all times!



#### \$500 Hunter Derby Presented by Gold Crest Fine Tack

2'6" with high options at 2'9" - 2'11" Class 201. Entry Fee: \$45

This performance hunter class presents competitors an opportunity to best showcase the talents of horse and rider over a challenging course with performance and handy options. The class combines a Hunter Classic with a Handy Hunter class in a one round format.

1. Hunter score (out of 100) - The class is judged as a handy hunter class with a score

2. Performance bonus - bonus points awarded for each high performance option taken on course (e.g., higher jump, natural jumps, more challenging line options), at least three options will be offered on course.

3. Handy bonus– Zero to ten additional bonus points awarded at the judge's discretion for additional handiness and high performance displayed on course, including: Unique turns, inside turns, athleticism and boldness, impressionable start and finish.

Formal attire required. Prize money divided to the top 6 \$150. \$110, \$75, \$65, \$60, \$50. Ribbons through 8th place.

#### \$1,000 Hunter Derby Presented by Littleton Equine Medical Center

3' with high options at 3'3" - 3'5" Class 202. Entry Fee: \$70

This performance hunter class presents competitors an opportunity to best showcase the talents of horse and rider over a challenging course with performance and handy options. The class combines a Hunter Classic with a Handy Hunter class in a one round format.

1. Hunter score (out of 100) - The class is judged as a handy hunter class with a score

2. Performance bonus - bonus points awarded for each high performance option taken on course (e.g., higher jump, natural jumps, more challenging line options), at least three options will be offered on course.

3. Handy bonus– Zero to ten additional bonus points awarded at the judge's discretion for additional handiness and high performance displayed on course, including: Unique turns, inside turns, athleticism and boldness, impressionable start and finish.

Formal attire required. Prize money divided to the top 8 \$300, \$220, \$150, \$100, \$70, \$60. \$50, \$50. Ribbons through 8th place.

#### \$500 Rocky Mountain Horse Rescue Gambler's Choice 2'3" - 3'6"

Class 203 - Entry Fee: \$45

\$10 from each rider in this class will be donated directly to The Rocky Mountain Horse Rescue! Additionally, Gold Crest will put together a feed or supply donation based on the RMHR's needs! Winners will have the option to take prize money off their show fees, receive a check from Gold Crest, or add back their winnings to the Rocky Mountain Horse Rescue.

If your mount for this class is a RECUE HORSE, please submit a bio at the show office to be read by the announcer during your round, showcasing your horse's special story. Rescue horses may take an additional \$5 off their entry fee for this class.

In this competition, each obstacle carries a value from 10 points to 120 points depending upon difficulty. Obstacles will be built so that they may be jumped in both directions. After the starting tone, the competitor must cross the start line in either direction to start their time. They must then jump the obstacles, in either direction, a maximum of three times each, with the goal being to accumulate the highest point total. Disobediences are not penalized except for time taken. If an obstacle is knocked down, no points will be awarded. If an obstacle is jumped after being knocked down, no points will be awarded. If an obstacle is jumped after being knocked down, no points will be awarded. If an obstacle is jumped a fourth time, no points will be awarded. When the 60 seconds has expired, a tone will sound and the competitor must cross the finish line to stop their time. At the conclusion of the round, and after their score has been announced, a tone will sound again and the competitor will have 30 seconds to attempt the Joker Jump. If jumped successfully, an additional 200 points will be added to their score. If a disobedience or knockdown occurs on the first attempt, 200 points will be deducted from their score. Only one attempt is allowed. The winner will be the competitor who has the highest point total in the fastest time. Fences 2'3" to 3'6" (Joker jump may be higher). Open to all horses and ponies. Entries must have competed in at least one other class at this show. Prize money divided to the top 6: \$150. \$110, \$75, \$65, \$60, \$50. Ribbons through 8th place.

#### \$1,000 Mini Prix Presented by Littleton Equine Medical Center

WHAT IS THE COLORADO HUNTER JUMPER FOUNDATION? The Colorado Hunter Jumper Foundation is a 501 (c)3 that was incorporated in 2010. The Foundation provides educational sponsorships, supports equine charities, provides achievement opportunities and emergency financial support to individuals and families in the hunter jumper community.

WHAT IS THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN HORSE RESCUE? The Rocky Mountain Horse Rescue (RMHR) was started in 2004 by Eugenia "Bini" Abbott on the Abbott Ranch in Arvada, CO. Bini, a resident of Colorado for 60 years, has been actively involved in horse rescue since the age of fourteen. She helped rescue horses with Colorado Horse Rescue throughout the 80s and 90s and co-founded the Horse Protection League (HPL) in 1994 in Arvada prior to starting RMHR. RMHR is dedicated to the rescue, welfare, and care of Horses, Ponies, Mules, and Donkeys. We are a 501(c)(3) organization and were 100% volunteer through January of 2019 when an injury to Bini required us to hire some part time help.

In 2004 we identified an immediate need to rescue horses that had been impounded. Since then we have been contacted by families facing financial difficulties, moves, deaths and other crisis situations that forced them to part with their animals. We've learned that a rescue means more than putting weight back on. It means rehabilitating a horse so that its adoptable. It involves educating individuals and groups on animal welfare. We give advice and counsel to daily callers. When we can't take a horse we can direct them to other solutions. We provide a lifetime commitment to the animals we take in and are the forever home for those that we cannot place. Over time we learned that rescues sometimes require equipment. Our slings and lifts have been used as far away as Alaska and as nearby as a local swimming pool.

WHAT IS THE CHARITY CHALLENGE? We are on a mission to raise money and awareness for the Colorado Hunter Jumper Foundation! This year we are also partnering with The Rocky Mountain Horse Rescue to give them a helping hand as well! We are thrilled to support these charities that help humans and equines within our own community.

Gold Crest will donate two dollars for each class entered to The Colorado Hunter Jumper Foundation.

## **COVID 19 PROTOCOL- ALL IN ATTENDANCE MUST READ:**

At Gold Crest we are trusting you to follow the below procedures in order to keep yourself and others at a minimized risk.

-All entries are to be made electronically through horseshowing.com or emailed to coshowentries @gmail.com.

-EXHIBITORS MUST SIGN IN UPON ARRIVAL AT THE FACILITY AND SIGN A FORM FOR CONTACT TRACING TO BE USED IN THE EVENT OF AN OUTBREAK.

-Please take your temperature in the morning and scratch your entry if you have a fever. Do not come if you have COVID-19 symptoms or if you have been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19.

-Everyone should be mindful of space and keep a minimum of 6 feet away from any other person.

-Masks must be worn anywhere on the show grounds. Masks are not required to be worn by mounted riders.

-Trainer packets are to be picked up in the office by one representative and will only be handed out when all entries have a check attached. (Trainer may leave a barn check and will be responsible for any open accounts.)

- Rotations will be set up with the gate person on a first come first served basis. If you miss your rotation, or do not sign up for one, you will ride at the end of the division.

-The gate person has complete authority of the arena entrance and will manage the entrance to limit numbers.

-Only essential people may accompany horses to the warm-up area and back gate. This could include the trainer, a groom and one family member if the rider is a junior. All others should go directly from the trailer parking area to the viewing area at the show ring to watch their family member or barn mate compete.

-Due to COVID-19, show hospitality will be greatly limited this year. You should plan to bring your own water as paper cups and water dispensers will not be available at the back gate.
