SHOW RULES

Entries will be accepted on the day of show. However, a \$25.00 day of show penalty will apply after the closing date.

Fees:

- Regular classes \$35.00
- Medal Classes \$35.00
- Derby Class \$65.00
- Post Entry Fee \$25.00 ENTRY DEADLINE AUGUST 23RD 8:00 PM
- Day of Show Penalty \$25.00
- EMT Fee \$20.00 per rider
- Office Fee \$30.00 per entry
- Grounds Fee \$30.00 non-stabled horses
- Eq O/F Jackpots \$20/\$25 (\$15.00 to RMHR)

1. All entry forms must be transmitted electronically. All fees should be made payable to: **MRC Horse Show. VENMO WILL BE AVAILABLE!!! Cash or Venmo are preferred.** Checks also accepted.
2. **No refunds will be given unless accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate.**
3. Stalls will be available per show day. The stalls will not be bedded. Bedding will be available, please call to reserve stalls and order bedding. Carole - 303-910-9410 **All stalls are required to have a four bag minimum per CHP regulations. ALL BEDDING MUST BE PRE-ORDERED. You may bring in your own bedding however a \$25 fee will be charged for bringing your own or purchasing less than the 4 bag minimum per stall.**

Stall charges as follows:

1 DAY (NO OVERNIGHT) \$65

2 DAY/ 1 NIGHT \$115.00

ENTIRE WEEKEND (FRIDAY-SUNDAY) \$160

Regulations:

1. Back to back rounds allowed and encouraged.
2. No-judges will be allowed if time permits.
3. Approved ASTM helmets must be worn at all times by all riders while on Colorado Horse Park property.
4. Controlled schooling will be allowed from 6:30 am until 30 minutes prior to the start of the ring. Schooling times on any one horse may be limited if other horses are waiting.
5. The show management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any class(es) should it be in the best interest of the show.
6. Only one horse per entry form.
7. A one minute gate and/or a posted order of go may be imposed by management in order to maintain a reasonable pace for the show.
8. Each class will award a first place trophy and ribbons through sixth place. Champion and Reserve will be offered for all divisions.
9. There will be a \$50.00 charge for all returned checks. Accounts will be given 5 days to be paid in full by cash or equivalent.
10. Pets must be on a leash at all times!
11. Non-showing horses must be entered and pay a grounds fee, an emt fee and an office fee. Stall and bedding fees where applicable.

ENTRY PROCEDURES: Entries must be received by 8:00 pm Wednesday the 23rd to avoid the Post Entry Fee. If you enter on the day of show, an additional Day of Show Fee will be charged. On the day of show make any changes before picking up your number. After picking up your number you are financially responsible for your entries. No extra charge for adding classes as long as you add them prior to riding in the class. Classes may **NOT** be added at the gate. You must add and scratch in the office PRIOR to the start of the class or you will be charged.

For all rated classes please view rules and specs in the CHJA Rulebook. The Rulebook is also available online at www.chja.org.

FRIDAY SCHOOLING WILL BE AVAILABLE - Schooling spots must be reserved in advance by the trainer before noon Thursday. All spots reserved will be charged to the trainer and are non-refundable. Trainers may split these to their riders if done so in the show office before 10:00 am Saturday. Schooling reservations must be in writing by email or text. No phone reservations. The names of the riders/horses must be included for billing purposes. Sessions will cost \$30.00 per horse. Time of session will be determined by the number of horses needing to get in the ring. **Schooling 1:00pm – 6pm. RESERVE SCHOOLING BY THURSDAY NOON!**

Open to horse/rider combinations eligible to show at the respective heights offered in this class. Riders may show as many horses as they wish. To be eligible, horses must have competed in at least one class over fences on Saturday at this show in any 2'6"-2'9" or 3'-3'3" hunter/equitation division or any jumper division class .75M or higher.

To be judged by two judges giving one score. The first round will be a traditional classic round with a minimum of 10 obstacles and a minimum of three high options. The handy round will consist of 8 obstacles with a minimum of two high options. The Top 8 will return for the handy round. One point will be added to each horse's score per high option jumped successfully. No In and Outs.

Hacking only will be allowed in the arena up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the class. (An additional schooling session will be offered after the conclusion of the Derby for those not participating in the Derby)

BIOSECURITY AT THE COLORADO HORSE PARK

Bio Security at the Colorado Horse Park

Required:

1. A current negative Coggins test required for all horses entering the facility.
2. Statement of Health/Veterinary Health Certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of arrival at CHP, documenting that the horse has:
 - A. Received regular and consistent vaccination against Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 with the most recent booster being within 180 days. Written statements from Vet explaining the reasons for being bolstered within 180 days MAY be accepted. IN NO CASES MAY THE BOOSTER BE OUTSIDE OF 180 DAYS. Horses not in compliance with this rule will be denied entry to the competition grounds upon request by Management.
 - B. Not shown symptoms of or been treated for EHV-1/4 within the past 28 days.
 - C. Not been at a facility under quarantine for EHV-4/1 or exposed to any horse showing symptoms of EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days.
3. Vaccination record showing date of vaccination against Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 (booster must be within 180 days).
4. Horses who have been in California within 14 days may be subject to additional screening and vet inspection.

Vaccination record

All documents must be in the horse's show name.

Horses must enter off Bayou Gulch Road. No entrance through the S. Pinery Dr. Gate. No horse may be unloaded until documents are checked. No stall assignments will be given in advance.

In response to the recent EHV-1 outbreak in California and similar cases reported in other states, the Colorado Horse Park (CHP) is increasing biosecurity protocols to help keep your horses safe, as well as those of your fellow competitors.

Upon Arrival:

- We require all barns to check the temperature of all horses once they arrive at CHP, prior to entering the barn. If a horse has a temperature of 101.5 or higher, CHP management **must be contacted immediately**, and the horse placed in an isolation stall on-site to allow for time to recheck temperature prior to entering the show barn.
- CHP will require all barns on CHP show grounds to maintain a temperature log with twice-daily temperatures recorded and the log must be posted on each horse's stall door. Random checks of temperature logs by the Barn Manager and Stewarding staff will take place.
- Any horse on the show grounds with a fever must be reported to CHP Management immediately. It is always better to err on the side of safety. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds and/or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.

It is our shared responsibility to keep our horses safe. Similar to the suggested protocols in place for humans due to COVID-19, we urge all equestrians to please remember and abide by additional biosecurity measures.

Additional Recommendations:

- Avoid mixing of horses where possible, practice equine 'social distancing'
- Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices and impress its importance to your grooms and barn managers in everyday care.
- Bring your own hoses to barns and do not share water buckets or fill from hoses used by other horses. Communal hoses will NOT be provided in the barns during this time. Please bring your own.
- Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses shipped long distances. Extra hours on a horse van or moving from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horses' and your neighbor's horses' health.

Any human COVID procedures in place at the time of the show will be enforced. (USEF, State, Federal and local)

Additional Bio-Security protocols for horses arriving from California

Following the recent outbreak of vesicular stomatitis (VS) in Riverside, San Bernardino and San Diego Counties in California, LEG Shows & Events and the Colorado Horse Park are following the US Equestrian guidelines and recommendations, as outlined here by the Equine Disease Communication Center. All horses who have travelled from CA to the Colorado Horse Park will be stabled in a separate stabling area reserved only for those horses. LEG Shows & Events will have additional requirements to the required Veterinary Horse Health Certificate for all horses arriving from California.

This additional information includes: Confirmation of examination of horses within five days prior to arrival at the Colorado Horse Park. The certificate must include the following statement: "I have examined the animal(s) represented on this certificate of veterinary inspection and have found no clinical signs of vesicular stomatitis and they have not originated from a premises under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis."

A three day temperature log (for the three days prior to departure) for each horse must also be provided. Upon arrival at the Colorado Horse Park, each horse that has travelled from CA will be examined by a qualified, licensed and accredited veterinarian or their designated, trained technician prior to entry to the stabling area. Horses may be required to be removed from the trailer for inspection if access is restricted.

Upon arrival, please be prepared to provide each horses veterinary health certificate from within five days of arrival, and the three-day temperature log. Temperature logs for all horses stabled in the "California Stabling" are required to be posted on each horses stall. In addition we ask that the following precautions be adhered to for all horses competing at the Colorado Horse Park:

- Temperature charts will be supplied and horses' temperatures must be taken twice daily. Competition Stewards will be spot checking temperature logs for all horses. Please make sure that the logs are readily available. Any temperature over 101.5°F shall be immediately reported to competition management.
- Exhibitors are required to observe horses for clinical signs of vesicular lesions and report immediately any signs to the attending horse show veterinarian or competition management. There will be immediate isolation of any horses with vesicular lesions. The following biosecurity management measures are also highly recommended:
 - Eliminate whenever possible common water sources during the event.
 - Strongly discourage the use of shared equipment and tack between participants.
 - Minimize exposure to fly vectors through use of fly wipes, sprays, foggers, and other repellents for use on animals, applied as directed by label instructions.
