

#### **SHOW RULES and ENTRY PROCEDURES**

Entries will be accepted on the day of show. However, a \$30.00 day of show penalty will apply after the closing date.

#### Fees:

•	Regular classes	\$35.00
•	Medal Classes	\$35.00
•	Post Entry Fee	\$30.00
•	Day of Show Penalty	\$30.00
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EMT Fee \$25.00 per riderOffice Fee \$35.00 per entry

Grounds Fee \$40.00 non-stabled horses

Stalls will be available per show day. The stalls will not be bedded. Bedding will be available, please call to reserve stalls and order bedding. Carole - 303-910-9410 All stalls are required to have a five bag minimum per CHP regulations. ALL BEDDING MUST BE PRE-ORDERED. You may bring in your own bedding however a \$30 fee will be charged for bringing your own.

## Stall charges as follows: 1 DAY (NO OVERNIGHT) \$70 Two days \$140.00 ENTIRE WEEKEND (FRIDAY-SUNDAY) \$200 SAME HORSE ONLY FOR DISCOUNT

- All entries must be received no later than 8:00 PM on Monday AUGUST 18th. Entries received after the deadline will be wait-listed and added if
  arenas have room.
- All entry forms must be submitted through Horseshowing.com and must be filled out in entirety including classes you are entering. Any entry
  submitted without classes will not be accepted and will run the risk of being closed out of sold-out classes.
- Only one horse per entry blank.
- Entries will be capped if demand warrants,
- JUMPERS PLEASE pre-enter THREE (3) and only 3 classes. Any horse/rider combination showing in the jumper ring may only show in 3 classes
  in that ring. If time allows, we will lift that cap on entries. You can change classes when you pick up your number.
- HUNTERS/EQUITATION PLEASE pre-enter all classes you intend to show in. Entries in your rings may be capped if demand warrants. You can
  change classes when you pick up your entry but may not be able to add any additional classes.
- Classes may not be added at the in gate without approval of show management. If approved, you still must come to the office to add or scratch.
   YOU WILL BE CHARGED FOR SCRATCHED CLASSES UNLESS YOU OFFICIALLY SCRATCH ON PAPER IN THE OFFICE BEFORE THE START OF THE CLASS.
- Once your number has been picked up, you are responsible for all charges and fees.
- 1. Payment will be accepted via Cash, Check, Venmo and Zelle. No credit card payments.
- 2. There will be a \$50.00 charge for all returned checks. Accounts will be given 5 days to be paid in full by cash or equivalent. Exhibitors who do not settle their accounts will be reported to the CHJA and may be ineligible to compete in subsequent competitions.
- 3. Feed/ Bedding/Stabling: All stalls are required (per CHP) to use a minimum of 5 bags of shavings. You may bring your own but will still be required to bed with a minimum of 5 bags of shavings. Those bringing in their own bedding will be charged an additional \$30.00 cleaning fee. NO EXCEPTIONS! Shavings and Hay will be available for purchase. Stall reservations and bedding orders MUST be received by Wednesday. CALL CAROLE TO RESERVE STALLS AND BEDDING: (303) 910-9410.
- 4. Approved ASTM helmets must be worn at all times by all riders while on CHP property.
- 5. Back-to-back rounds are encouraged.
- 6. No judges will be allowed if time permits.
- 7. Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any class(es) should it be in the best interest of the show.
- 8. A one-minute gate and/or posted order may be implemented at management's discretion.
- 9. Each class will be awarded a 1<sup>st</sup> place prize and ribbons through 6<sup>th</sup> place. Champion and Reserve will be awarded in all divisions. No receipts, ribbons or prizes will be made available after the show has ended. Please check out in the office to review your bill and pick up your awards,
- 10. Pets must be on a leash at all times!
- 11. Any exhibitor, trainer, owner, spectator, parent or any other person may be asked to leave the grounds for the breaking of any show rules or procedures or for being rude or belligerent toward any member of the show staff or show official. Poor behavior will not be tolerated. No refunds will be given should you be removed from the show.

Open to horse/rider combinations eligible to show at the respective heights offered in this class. Riders may show as many horses as they wish. To be eligible, horses must compete in at least one other class over fences on Saturday or Sunday at this show in any 2'6"-2'9" or 3'-3'3" hunter/equitation division or any jumper division class .75M or higher. Prep classes are offered in the derby ring on Saturday!

To be judged by two judges giving one score. The first round will be a traditional classic round with a minimum of 10 obstacles and a minimum of three high options. The handy round will consist of 8 obstacles with a minimum of two high options. The Top 12 from the classic round will return for the handy round. One point will be added to each horse's score per high option jumped successfully (no rail, no refusal). No In and Outs. The Classic Round will start with the 3'-3'3" entrants. The Handy Round will start with the 2'6"-2'9" entrants.

Only Hacking and hand walking will be allowed in the arena up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the class. (An additional schooling session will be offered after the conclusion of the Derby for those not participating in the Derby.) You may walk the course at any time between 6:30 AM to 7:40AM. The arena will be groomed promptly at 7:40 AM and the first horse will enter the ring promptly at 8:00 AM. A posted order will be followed in the Classic Round in each respective height. For the Handy Round, horses will return in reverse order of score (low to high) in each respective height.

If necessary, in the interest of time management, Show Management reserves the right to change the format to a "Hunt and Go" format.

#### BIOSECURITY AT THE COLORADO HORSE PARK

PRE-CHECK ENDS 48 HOURS BEFORE show start.

#### Bio Security at the Colorado Horse Park

#### **Required:**

- 1. A current negative Coggins test required for all horses entering the facility.
- 2. Statement of Health/Veterinary Health Certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian within 30 days of arrival at CHP, documenting that the horse has:
- A. Received regular and consistent vaccination against Equine Influenza and EHV 1 & 4 with the most recent booster being within 180 days. Written statements from Vet explaining the reasons for being bolstered within 180 days MAY be accepted. IN NO CASES MAY THE BOOSTER BE OUTSIDE OF 180 DAYS. Horses not in compliance with this rule will be denied entry to the competition grounds upon request by Management.
- B. Not shown symptoms of or been treated for EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days.
- C. Not been at a facility under quarantine for EHV-4/1 or exposed to any horse showing symptoms of EHV-4/1 within the past 28 days.
- 3. Current Vaccination against WNV, EEE, WEE, Tetanus. Rabies vaccines are strongly recommended.
- 4. The following statement must be included on the Health Certificate. "I have examined the animal(s) on this certificate of veterinary inspection and have found no clinical signs of vesicular stomatitis and they have not originated from a premises under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis.

#### Vaccination record

All documents must be in the horse's show name.

Horses must enter off Bayou Gulch Road. No entrance through the S. Pinery Dr. Gate. No horse may be unloaded until documents are checked. No stall assignments will be given in advance.

In response to the recent EHV-1 outbreak in California and similar cases reported in other states, the Colorado Horse Park (CHP) is increasing biosecurity protocols to help keep your horses safe, as well as those of your fellow competitors.

#### **Upon Arrival:**

- We require all barns to check the temperature of all horses once they arrive at CHP, prior to entering the barn. If a horse has a temperature of 101.5 or higher, CHP management **must be contacted immediately,** and the horse placed in an isolation stall on-site to allow for time to recheck temperature prior to entering the show barn.
- CHP will require all barns on CHP show grounds to maintain a temperature log with twice-daily temperatures recorded and the log must be posted on each horse's stall door. Random checks of temperature logs by the Barn Manager and Stewarding staff will take place.
- Any horse on the show grounds with a fever must be reported to CHP Management immediately. It is always better to err on the side of safety. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds and/or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.

It is our shared responsibility to keep our horses safe. Similar to the suggested protocols in place for humans due to COVID-19, we urge all equestrians to please remember and abide by additional biosecurity measures.

#### **Additional Recommendations:**

- Avoid mixing of horses where possible, practice equine 'social distancing'
- Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices and impress its importance to your grooms and barn managers in everyday care.
- Bring your own hoses to barns and do not share water buckets or fill from hoses used by other horses. Communal hoses will NOT be provided in the barns during this time. Please bring your own.
- Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses shipped long distances. Extra hours on a horse van or moving from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horses' and your neighbor's horses' health. Any human COVID procedures in place at the time of the show will be enforced. (USEF, State, Federal and local)
