CURRENT IMPORTANT COVID-19 INFORMATION (as of May 15th, 2020)



The following are some of the current requirements and procedures, as of today, that will be followed during the shows. This is subject to change as requirements from the CDC, State and County health officials are updated. These updates will be available on the CEP website at www.cepshows.com and upon your arrival.

- Each stable attending should be diligent to make sure everyone coming is not ill and has no symptoms, brings and uses the proper personal protective equipment they feel necessary and practices proper social distancing and hand washing / sanitizing procedures to stay as safe as possible.
- All trainers are responsible for every person in their barn, including riders, owners, staff, grooms, family members and friends and must take their temperature using a non-contact infrared thermometer each day upon arrival and keep a written record of each person's name, arrival time and temperature. A form that you can use will be available on the CEP website soon. This record must be presented to the horse show office at the end of each week on Sunday afternoon ... you may retain a copy if you wish. As per the CDC, people are considered to have a fever if their temperature is 100.4 degrees or higher. Any person that scans a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher must immediately leave the grounds and contact their doctor for further treatment. If anyone has a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher, the trainer must immediately notify the horse show.
- Each stable is considered a family and will be provided stabling in blocks of stalls. This makes it critical that trainers submit a Block Stabling Request in a timely manner listing everyone in their barn to be stabled together.
- ALL ENTRIES MUST BE MAILED IN OR DONE ONLINE NO EXCEPTIONS ... you may not walk into the
 horse show office and fill out an entry blank ... mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, June 29th
 and received within seven (7) days. After June 29th, you must submit entries electronically, no exceptions!
- Each stable should designate a representative to handle all accounts with the show secretary and make
 every effort to only have this representative conducting business in the office. If that one person is not
 available to go to the office when needed, then another individual may take their place, but the idea is to
 have as few different people as possible going into the office.
- Management reserves the right to limit the number of persons in the horse show office at any given time ...
 such limitations will be posted on the door and those waiting outside to conduct business must do so by
 practicing proper social distancing from others that may be waiting as well.
- Management mandates that only essential people accompany horses to the warm-up area and the back gate ... this could include the trainer, a groom and one family member. All others should go directly from the barn to the show ring to watch their family member or barn mate compete while practicing social distancing.
- Proper social distancing, both among people and horses, in the stabling areas, warm-up rings, back gates
 and seating / viewing areas must be exercised at all times ... horse show staff have full authority to ask
 groups to disperse if necessary.
- Take a picture of your course and watch some trips before you school to reduce traffic and time spent at the gate and course board.
- Be sure to bring your own water as water cups and dispensers will not be available at the back gates.
- All horse show staff will be wearing masks and all competitors are encouraged to do so as well. Masks are
 optional while mounted and will not be penalized by judges if worn in the show ring. Please keep in mind
 that the wearing of masks by competitors may become mandatory if so declared by the CDC, State or
 County health officials, so everyone is encouraged to bring them just in case.

Updates, changes and additions to this list and further information will be published on the CEP website as it becomes available from the CDC, State and County health officials. Please check it often. Trainers must review the latest procedures and precautions related to CEP's Covid-19 Plan with their clients prior to arrival to the show, are responsible for their clients actions during the show and must understand that repeated issues may result in their clients being excused from the show and removed from the grounds. SIMPLE AND EASY TO ENTER IN ADVANCE - HERE'S ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW

If mailing in your entries, you may enclose a check (payable to Estes Park Horse Shows for \$100) or complete the credit card section on the entry blank. This must be postmarked by the mailing entry closing date (Monday, June 29th). If entering electronically (email or fax), you must complete the credit card section on the entry blank and it must be submitted by the electronic entry closing date (Monday, July 6th). If entering using one of the online entry services, you'll need to submit credit card information directly on those websites. All entries received properly and with proper payment will qualify for the \$50 Good Entry Discount. All other horse show fees will be placed on your account and can be paid for when closing out at the end of the show. Please do not send in a signed, open check. If you do, the check will be kept on file for the show, which means you won't qualify for the \$50 Good Entry Discount. Be sure to see the Entry Procedures page in this prize list for more information.

IMPORTANT COVID-19 INFORMATION

Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, CEP will be publishing a Covid-19 Action Plan for these shows based upon recommendations and requirements from the CDC, State of Colorado Department of Health and Larimer County Department Of Health and Environment. You will see a current list of requirements in this prize list, but as the pandemic is fluid and always changing, the list of requirements may also change. NEW FORMAT FOR CHJA / USHJA MEMBER BENEFITS CLINIC

After many years of hosting a limited, mounted riding clinic, this year's clinic is changing its format to allow more people to participate and get a unique education from two clinicians. The clinic will start at 8:30am and go until 5:00pm, with participants learning about the ins and outs of basic hunter and equitation course design, followed by a session on hunter and equitation judging, both over fences and on the flat. After lunch, attendees will get to judge several classes with demonstration riders, complete with comparison and discussion of the results. The day ends with a Q&A session. TRAINERS ... STALLS, HORSE COUNTS AND TRAINER ACCOUNTS

Trainers are requested to submit final stall counts (horse and tack stalls for each week) not later than Monday, July 6th by completing a Block Stabling Request Form (found on the CEP website at www.cepshows.com) and emailing or faxing it (entries@cepshows.com or fax 602-428-6804). If you do not submit this form by this date, then your stall count and barn assignment will be based solely upon your entries received. Also, please do not send in signed, open checks for your trainer account. We'll set-up your trainer account and reserve your tack stalls as you request, then you can bring a check or credit card to the office upon your arrival at the show ... we trust you! What we don't trust is a signed, open check floating around the country in the mail!

Please note: the Pavilion Barn Building will not be available for move-in prior to 9:00am on Tuesday.

Copper Penny II: Horses may arrive anytime after 1:00pm on Monday, July 20th; horses must depart by 8:00pm on Sunday, July 26th.

SCHOOLING IN THE SHOW RINGS

Hunter Rings: Open schooling is permitted on warm-up days (Wednesday, July 15th and Tuesday, July 21st) from 11am to 5pm. Each show morning, hunter rings are open for schooling up until 20-40 minutes before their start time (see Daily Schedule for times and exceptions). Each afternoon, hunter rings may be open for schooling after being rebuilt, time and weather / footing conditions permitting.

Jumper Ring: Open on Wednesday, July 15th and Tuesday, July 21st for warm-up rounds at \$25 / round as follows: #601 - 10:00am-11:30am at 3'6" / #602 - 11:30am-1:00pm at 3'0" / #603 - 1:30pm-3:30pm at 2'6" / #604 - 3:30pm to 4:30pm at 2'0". You must enter the schooling classes and wear your number. No other schooling over fences in the jumper ring is scheduled during the shows. Hacking only is allowed on warm-up day from 4:30pm to 5:00pm at no charge. Hacking only may be permitted each afternoon, by request, after the ring is built, time and weather / footing conditions permitting.

ALL 500 SERIES WARM-UP CLASSES: Enter by individual class numbers on the schedule. Entry Fee: \$25 per class

To be held open during each set of classes with concurrent heights. Hunter and Equitation warm-up classes to be run as a Blue / Red with scores of 85 and above receiving a Blue ribbon and scores of 75-84 receiving a Red ribbon. Scores below 75 will not receive a ribbon. Warm-Up classes held before equitation classes will allow equitation tack and attire. Jumper Warm-Up classes will allow jumper tack and attire and will be scored under Table II Clear Round. All warm-up classes are open to any horse and rider. No cross entry restrictions except for Pony warm-ups, which are limited to ponies ridden by a junior rider. Entries may compete in these classes as many times as they wish with the following two conditions: 1) entries must compete in the correct order of classes, meaning if the entry competes in the next class in the schedule after the warm-up class, they may not go back and do another warm-up round (exception: you may come back and do another warm-up round after all of your classes are done); 2) as long as the ring schedule is not full and declared closed for the day (management reserves the right to limit entries or, in the event the ring schedule is overloaded, to cancel these classes entirely if necessary).

SPECIAL CLASSES

Deadline for entries into these Special Classes is 5:00pm the day before the class is scheduled to be held. Entries after this time, if accepted, will pay a \$25 Post Entry Fee and go first in the order. Scratches out of these Special Classes must be conducted in the horse show office by 5:00pm the day before the class is scheduled to be held. Scratches after this time will forfeit the entry fee unless due to an injury to horse or rider and a vet certificate (from the official horse show veterinarian only) or medical release form (from the official horse show medical personnel only) is presented to the office at the time of the scratch. Special classes with less than eight entries at 5:00pm the day before may be canceled or combined at management's discretion.

Week 1 Only

To be eligible, horses must have competed in at least two hunter classes at this show (warm-up classes do not qualify). This will be a two-round class. One round must be ridden by a professional and the other round must be ridden by a junior or amateur. In the first round, entries must jump a typical hunter classic style course. The second round will be over a hunter handy style course. Either rider may do either course, but the switch of riders after the first round must take place in a designated change box in the arena. One groom may assist in the switch, as a change of saddle will be permitted. The switch must not exceed 60 seconds in duration and there may be no communication between riders. If the 60 second clock expires prior to the horse exiting the change box, one point per full second over will be deducted from the overall score. An official time keeper will be in the box monitoring the time and letting the entry know when their time is about to lapse. Open numerical scoring system with two judges sitting together and throwing one score. Fences 2'9". Prize money divided \$300, \$220, \$150, \$100, \$70, \$60, \$50, \$50. To be eligible, horses must have competed in at least two other jumper classes at the same show. In this competition, there will be 12 obstacles set in the arena. Each obstacle carries a value from 10 points to 120 points. Obstacles will be built so that they may be jumped in both directions. After the starting tone, the competitor must cross the start line in either direction to start their time. They must then jump the obstacles, in either direction, a maximum of two times each, with the goal being to accumulate the highest point total. Disobediences are not penalized except for time taken. If an obstacle is knocked down, no points will be awarded. If an obstacle is jumped after being knocked down, no points will be awarded. When the 60 seconds has expired, a tone will sound and the competitor must cross the finish line to stop their time. At the conclusion of the round, and after their score has been announced, a tone will sound again and the competitor will have 30 seconds to attempt the Joker Jump. If jumped successfully, an additional 200 points will be added to their score. If a disobedience or knockdown occurs, 200 points will be deducted from their score. Only one attempt is allowed. Riders will jump a short course of fences at 2'6" in height. After jumping the last fence, riders will ride into a designated area and dismount, handing their horse to a helper. They will then get on or in a golf cart driven by a team mate (driver must be at least 16 years of age and have a valid driver's license issued by a state government ... a learner's permit is not acceptable) and negotiate a course of obstacles. Knocking any rails down or tennis balls off cones will incur a time penalty of 5 seconds each. The winner is the team crossing the finish line in the fastest overall time. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both directions of the ring. Entries may be asked to hand gallop, but never more than eight at a time. Entries will be brought to the middle one at a time until only the winner remains on the rail. Prize money divided \$250, \$150, \$100 to the top three. Many thanks to The Wild Ranch / Andrea Van Meenan for sponsoring the Open Under Saddle Derby.

421. ESTES TEAM JUMPER RELAY 2'0"/2'6"/3'0" - Entry Fee: \$10 per team member

This class will consist of teams of three riders comprised of professionals, juniors and amateurs, however, no team may have more than one professional. Professionals may compete on more than one team as long as they ride a different horse on each team they are on. Horses and junior / amateur riders may only compete on one team. Teams will enter the ring and position themselves anywhere they would like. The designated 2'0" rider will be handed the baton as they enter the ring. When the tone sounds, the first rider must pass through the start line to begin their time and jump fences numbered 1 through 5 set at 2'0". After jumping fence #5, the first rider must pass the baton to the second rider, who will then jump fences numbered 6 through 10 set at 2'6". After jumping fence #10, the second rider must pass the baton to the third rider, who will then jump fences numbered 11 through 15 set at 3'0", then pass through the finish line to stop their time. Faults will be incurred as normal under Table II; Section 1 except the first two cumulative refusals will not be penalized except for time taken. A third cumulative refusal will result in elimination. Any fall of a horse or rider will also result in elimination. If the baton is dropped at any time, any team member may dismount, pick it up, hand it back to the rider and remount. No others may assist in picking up a dropped baton. A maximum of fifteen teams will be allowed. Entries for this class will close either at 5:00pm on Thursday or when fifteen teams have entered the class, whichever comes first. When entering, each entry must enter the class normally on their entry blanks or add / scratch form, plus fill out the team declaration form and list their back number, horse and rider name, team name, team theme song and what height each team member will jump. Theme song requests will only be honored if teams are entered by 5:00pm Thursday ... late entries will have a song chosen by the judge. Team names and theme songs must be appropriate for all ages. Costumes are encouraged (not required) and a special award will be presented to the team with the best costume. Proper hard hats and heels are required. Entry Fee is \$10 per team member (\$30 per team). The judge's decision on any rule interpretations not covered above will be final.

2020 COPPER PENNY HORSE SHOWS ** RULES & REGULATIONS

All classes offered will be conducted in accordance with the CHJA Bylaws, Rules & Specifications, except as superseded by rule changes published in the CHJA Newsletter or on the CHJA website.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

One horse per entry blank. Mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, June 29th and must be received within seven (7) days of the postmark. Electronic entries (faxed, emailed and online) close Monday, July 6th and must be submitted on or before this date.

For each horse entered, you must pay a \$100 Registration Fee. If you mail your entry, you may include a check for \$100 payable to Estes Park Horse Shows, which will be deposited on the entry closing date. Or you may complete the Credit Card section on the entry blank and your credit card will be charged this amount, plus a 3% Convenience Fee, on the entry closing date. Once charged, the Convenience Fee is not refundable or creditable under any circumstances. Do not send in a signed, open check. If you do, it will be kept on file for the show, but since it cannot be deposited, it is considered an incomplete entry and you will not qualify for the Early Entry Discount. The show is not responsible for any lost or misdirected mail.

Trainers may pick up their client's numbers in the office whether their client's accounts have a form of payment or not. Trainers are financially responsible for all of their client's accounts should a form of payment not be provided by the client at the end of the show.

Exhibitors may pick up their numbers in the office by providing a form of payment to guarantee their account. If you entered and provided credit card information on your entry blank or you entered via Equestrian Connect, the office will have your credit card info on file and you will not have to complete this step. If you entered by sending in a check or you entered on Horseshowing.com, you will need to come to the office and present an open check or credit card to be placed on file.

Entries received by the closing date and adhering to the entry procedure outlined above will be considered complete and accepted, and will receive the \$50 Early Entry Discount. Late entries or entries not accompanied with a negotiable form of payment will not qualify for the \$50 Early Entry Discount. IMPORTANT: do not mail any entries after Monday, June 29th. If you do, your entry may be on its way to Arizona while we are on our way to Colorado, and we won't receive it. Mail entries to:

CONDITION OF ENTRY

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by Horse Show Management, their decision to be final. Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in classes, or make any changes management deems in the best interests of the show.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the show, CHJA, CEP, its members, directors and employees, the Town of Estes Park and the Estes Park Events Complex harmless for any loss or accident to horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

SHOW SCRATCH (a horse entered but scratched from the entire show prior to going in any classes) - 1) on or before the closing date of entries, all fees shall be refunded; 2) after the closing date of entries but prior to arrival on the grounds, the \$100 Registration Fee is not refundable and is forfeited as a Show Scratch Fee; 3) after arrival on the grounds but prior to showing in any classes, the stall fee and \$100 Registration Fee is not refundable and is forfeited as a Show Scratch Fee. If the entry qualified for the Good Entry Discount,, then the discount of \$50 will be refunded. All show scratches must be submitted in writing before the end of the show. No show scratch refund requests will be processed after the show is over.

ADDING REGULAR CLASSES: If you wish to add a regular class after initially checking in and picking up your number, you must do so by 5pm the day before the class is to be held and you must add it on an Add / Scratch Form or Trainer Sheet. Adds after 5pm or same day adds will only be allowed if the schedule in that ring is not full. Same day adds MUST be done on an Add / Scratch Form, NOT a Trainer Sheet, and MUST be given to the starter BEFORE the start of the class that was added. In any case, there is no charge to add a regular class.

SCRATCHING REGULAR CLASSES: If you do not intend to show in a regular class you have entered, you MUST scratch it on an Add / Scratch Form or Trainer Form in the horse show office before the class begins. There will be no charge for this. Scratches may not be done after a class has started. Telling the starter at the back gate that you are not going or simply not showing up will result in forfeiture of the entry fee. STARTERS DO NOT HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO SCRATCH YOU FROM A CLASS.

STALLS / HAUL-IN FEE - Stalls are \$200 for Copper Penny I and \$250 for Copper Penny II. Day Stalls and Pro-Rated stalls are not available. Haul-ins (no stall) must pay a \$50 weekly fee. All horses must pay either a Stall Fee or Haul-In Fee. Group stabling is available by visiting the CEP website at www.cepshows.com, downloading a Block Stabling Request and submitting it.

ATTIRE / EQUIPMENT - Proper basic show attire for the rider includes boots / jodhpur boots and britches and collared shirts (hunt coats optional). USEF rules will be followed for equipment for the horse. In any case, footwear with at least a 1/2" heel is required. A proper hard hat is mandatory for all riders while mounted. Martingales are prohibited in all under saddle and pleasure classes. All other questions regarding tack and equipment shall be at the sole discretion of the judge and/or show management, their decision to be final.

RETURNED CHECKS - A 10% PENALTY WILL BE ASSESSED FOR EVERY RETURNED CHECK (MINIMUM OF \$25)! Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the proper authorities for prosecution.

FEED AND BEDDING - Feed and bedding may be ordered from the horse show office and placed on your horse show account. Orders placed by noon will be delivered the same day. Orders placed after noon will be delivered the following day. Exception: no orders can be placed after noon on Saturday or anytime on Sunday, as the off-site retailer will be closed. For Pre-Orders, visit the CEP website at www.cepshows.com and download the Feed & Bedding Form. SHAVINGS MUST BE PURCHASED FROM THE ON-SITE FEED RETAILER AT THE SHOW. OUTSIDE SHAVINGS MAY NOT BE BROUGHT IN.

DAMAGE - Trainers and exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or employees, to buildings or other property, and shall be billed accordingly.

TRAINER SPLITS - As a courtesy, the show will split a trainer's account amongst all of the clients. Trainer Split forms must be completed by noon on Friday. If any of the trainer's clients have already checked out, the split will not include them.

DOGS - Must be kept on a leash at all times anywhere on the show grounds. Horse show management may fine individuals whose dogs are loose up to \$50 for each occurrence and this amount will be added to your account. Animal Control may be called for repeat violators..

SPLITTING / **COMBINING CLASSES** - Classes with 20 or more entries that compete will be California split (exception: warm-up classes will not be split). Classes with less than the required minimums will be combined, if possible, or canceled, if necessary. No classes will be divided or split with less than 20 entries.

GOLF CARTS - Golf-N-Fun Cars is the official golf cart concessionaire of the Estes Park Horse Shows. It is recommended that golf carts be reserved and paid for in advance by calling them at 970-218-5516. No carts will be available on the grounds for rental. All golf cart rentals must be arranged for in advance.

ACCOMMODATIONS - Due to the heavy influx of tourists, make your room reservations early. You may also contact the Estes Park Visitor's Center at 800-443-7837 or visit their website at www.visitestespark.com.

MEDICAL COVERAGE FEE - A \$25 Medic Fee will be charged to every horse each week to help offset the cost of on-site medical coverage.

IMPORTANT - DO NOT SEND ENTRIES IN THE MAIL AFTER MONDAY, JUNE 29th. IF YOU WISH TO ENTER THESE SHOWS AFTER THAT DATE, YOU MUST SUBMIT YOUR ENTRIES VIA FAX, EMAIL OR ONLINE. WE DON'T WANT YOUR ENTRIES GOING TO ARIZONA IN THE MAIL WHILE WE ARE HEADING TO COLORADO FOR THE SHOWS.

Pile Of Poles to be 4" single poles on the ground. Crossrail to be set no higher than 12" in the middle. 18" Section to be 18" verticals. 2'0" Section to be 2'0" verticals.

Learn the ins and outs of what judges look for, what they give credit for and what they deduct points for. Learn what to do and what not to do. Learn what drives a judge crazy and what makes them smile and appreciate you. Then after lunch, you'll pick up a clipboard and judge's cards, and you'll sit together and judge multiple hunter and equitation rounds, as well as two flat classes, designed for horses and riders in 2'0", 2'6" and 3'0" sessions. You can compare notes and see how you did next to one of the top hunter judges in the country. If you wish to participate as a demonstration rider, you may do so as well. You can plan to attend the clinic for the day and just break away in time to get your horse, warm-up and "show" in front of the others. Or, you can just attend the clinic all day and let others do the riding.

POLICY REGARDING NON-SHOWING HORSES

Non-showing horses are permitted. If a stall is needed, contact CEP 3-5 days prior to each show to verify availability. NON-SHOWING HORSES STABLING MUST PAY FOR A STALL AND WILL ONLY BE ALLOWED TO RENT STALLS IF THEY ARE NOT SOLD OUT. The following is the policy regarding non-showing horses:

- ⇒ Owners that have actively showing horses will be allowed to bring one non-showing horse at no charge ... additional horses are \$100 each
- ⇒ Owners that do not have a horse actively competing may bring non-showing horses and pay a \$100 Non-Showing Horse Fee
- ⇒ Trainers are permitted to bring up to two non-showing horses at no charge as long as such horses are owned by the trainer

A form with proper signatures must be filled out for each non-showing horse on the grounds. Please stop by the horse show office upon arrival, PRIOR to unloading your non-showing horse, to complete paperwork and pay the requisite fees.

Ring Scheduling, Same Day Adds & Cancellation / Combining of Classes

At 5:00pm every day, including warm-up / check-in day, the office stops accepting entries and all class entries for the next day are input into the computer and a schedule, including horse counts and class start / finish times, is created. This will be the official schedule, with counts and times, that will be available at the office and on the website by 6:00pm every day. This schedule shows each ring, how many entries are in each class, and what time each class, or group of classes, is scheduled to start. Remember, these times are approximate, and may vary slightly, but are designed to give you a general idea of when your classes will go. This way, you don't have to show up at 7:00am and just sit around until 11:00am for your class! Go have breakfast, get in a round of golf or catch the sunrise as it comes over the mountains.

Adding regular classes after 5:00pm for the next day, or adding regular classes the same day they are being held, is allowed as long as the schedule is not full in a particular ring. If the following day's schedule in a ring is full at 5:00pm the day before, then that ring is declared "closed" and will not allow same day adds. Trainers and exhibitors are urged to stop by the office before 5:00pm each day to verify their entries for the next day. This way, adds can be made before the 5:00pm deadline, and you are insured of getting into your classes.

At 5:00pm each day, when the final numbers are compiled and the schedule for the next day is created, management will make decisions about classes with less than the entry minimums. These classes are either canceled or combined with other classes, if possible. The class sheets are printed and judge's cards finalized. This next sentence is very important ... any classes canceled or combined WILL NOT BE UNCANCELED OR UNCOMBINED, regardless of how many entries actually show or wish to show in them. This is a firm policy and the only way to maintain reasonable control over a schedule that, if allowed to change in that manner, could push things back by hours. So be sure you are entered in all your desired classes by 5:00pm the day before. If the schedule fills up and the ring is declared 'closed', you won't be able to add into it.







Want To Show In A Hunter Classic or Jumper Derby On Week 2? How About For Free?

To be eligible for a Sunday Hunter Classic during CP II, horses must have competed in all of the classes over fences in a qualifying hunter section during the second week. To qualify for the free entry fee offer, horses must have competed in all of the classes over fences in a qualifying hunter section at both shows. To be eligible for a Sunday Jumper Derby during CP II, horses must have competed in at least two classes in a qualifying jumper section during the

second week. To qualify for the free entry fee offer, horses must have competed in at least two classes per show in a qualifying jumper section at both shows. Classics and Derbies and qualifying sections for each are:


\$500 All Stirrup Hunter Classic 2'3" - Short Stirrup Hunter 2'3", Medium Stirrup Hunter 2'3", Long Stirrup Hunter 2'3" **\$750 Beginner Junior / Amateur Hunter Classic 2'9"** - Beginner Junior Hunter 2'9", Beginner Amateur Hunter 2'9" **\$1000 CHJA Junior / Amateur Hunter Classic 3'0"** - CHJA Junior Hunter 3'0", CHJA Amateur Hunter 3'0"

\$500 CHJA Mini Jumper Derby 2'6"-2'9" - Puddle Jumper 2'6", Schooling Jumper 2'9"

\$1000 CHJA Low Jumper Derby 2'9"-3'0" - Schooling Jumper 2'9", Low Jumper 3'0"

\$2000 CHJA High Jumper Derby 3'0"-3'3" - Low Jumper 3'0", Low Training Jumper 3'3", High Training Jumper 3'6"

Horses may cross enter two consecutive-height jumper derbies if eligible. If you showed in qualifying classes at only the second show, you are still eligible to enter the classic or derby, you just have to pay the entry fee. So show both weeks and get a free entry fee into a hunter classic or jumper derby today!
